

Additional UPS Ground Saver Charges/Rates	
Definition	Charges
Non-Standard Cube Charge - Any package with L x W x H measuring more than 2 cubic feet (3456 cubic inches)	\$18.00 per package
Non-Standard Extra Length Charge -Any package with longest side measuring more than 30 inches and not exceeding 48 inches	\$6.00 per package
Non-Standard Length Charge -Any package with longest side measuring more than 22 inches and not exceeding 30 inches	\$2.00 per package
Delivery Area Surcharge - A surcharge will apply to each UPS Ground Saver package delivered to certain ZIP Codes within the 48 contiguous states - Refer to the Area Surcharge Listing at ups.com/rates for a listing of applicable ZIP Codes	– DAS: \$6.15 – DAS Extended: \$8.30 – Remote 48 Contiguous States: \$15.35
Dimensional Weight - UPS Ground Saver packages follow the same dimensional weight calculation formula as UPS® Ground - Divide the cubic size by the published divisor at the time of shipping to determine dimensional weight in pounds.	Billable weight
Demand Surcharge - An additional charge per package will apply to any package shipped during a Demand Period. Applicable Demand Periods and Peak Surcharges are available at ups.com/peaksurcharges and will be updated from time-to-time as Demand Periods and/or Demand Surcharges change. Notes:

- A fuel surcharge will be added to the UPS Ground Saver Rate. For current fuel surcharges refer to [ups.com/fuelsurcharge](https://www.ups.com/fuelsurcharge).
- Any fraction of a pound more than the weight shown in the rate chart is rounded up to the next whole pound.
- Billable weight is the weight used to calculate the rate. Billable weight for UPS Ground Saver packages will be the greater of the actual weight or dimensional weight. For information regarding how to calculate billable weight, see the UPS Rate and Service Guide at [ups.com/rates](https://www.ups.com/rates) in effect at the time of shipping. UPS may change the applicable divisor for calculating dimensional weight or elect to use a threshold factor at which dimensional weight applies without prior notice.
